Outreach

Green Sanctuary Team

Two Adult RE programs are scheduled by the Green Sanctuary Team in November:

On November 11, Ready for 100 lead Gary Allison will speak. He will:

- 1. Define the reasons for and specific requirements of a Ready for 100 effort to be the second city in Oklahoma to commit to having all electricity used within the City of Tulsa be generated by clean renewable sources by 2035, and all energy used within the City be provided by clean renewable sources by 2050.
- 2. Identify his 12 core team members, 5 campaign phases, and completion dates for each phase.

On **November 18**, Oklahoma Sierra Club Executive Director **Johnson Grimm-Bridgwater** will address planning for repealing/changing the solar dis-incentive legislation in place that prevents job-creating growth of solar energy in Oklahoma. This will have to be done for Ready for 100 to obtain a City of Tulsa commitment.



Cornucopia Sunday November 18

As in years past, the Sunday before Thanksgiving will be **Cornucopia Sunday**. We invite children, elders, and everyone in between to bring either a perishable or non-perishable (not out of date, please) food item to church on Sunday. We will collect them on the table in front of

the pulpit.

Our OutReach Committee has graciously agreed to find someone take all of the food to the **Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma** for distribution. We could use help that day collecting and boxing food at the end of worship.

MacArthur Elementary School

MacArthur is still in need of 62 more volunteer reading partners. This is a commitment of once or twice a week for 45 minutes. Reading Partners trains volunteers to work one-on-one with students struggling with reading. The volunteers follow a structured, research-
