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## THE FIVE TASKS OF INTERIM MINISTRY

What in the world will we be doing together in the next two years?

The primary task of the interim minister is to hold up a mirror to the congregation and ask, "Is this who you are?" and "Is this who you want to be?"

This is more than a simple survey. This is sacred work that goes beyond personal preferences. This is hard work that lifts up the best and worst in our identity and interactions as a progressive religious community. Where do we start?

**Heritage:** the past is the foundation of the present. What are the stories we tell that have shaped and formed Hope Unitarian Church?

**Leadership:** the present is the foundation of the future. How do we promote the emergence of new leaders and the recommitment of seasoned leaders?

**Mission:** our mission acts as a filter for congregational decisions. What are the congregations' mission and vision, its sense of purpose and direction?

**Connections:** our connections help us embody our mission. What are the relationships the congregation builds outside of itself?

**Future:** this is where the congregation turns its energy toward proactive decision-making. Who are we? Who are our neighbors? What are we called to do?

The interim time is often exciting. If it's done right, it will also be unsettling. The time has come, the future is now, and we're all in this together. Take a look in the mirror and tell me what you see.

# **BOARD NEWS**

At our September meeting, the Hope Board of Trustees voted to prohibit firearms in the church buildings and on church grounds. Of course, this prohibition will not apply to law enforcement personnel. We will soon have notices on all church entrances that announce this policy.



One of the board's goals for the 2019-2020 church year is to charge the congregation to narrow its social justice focus by concentrating on one or more of the three Actions of Immediate Witness (AIWs) that were affirmed at the UUA's General Assembly in June. At our October 13, we will present those three AIWs and discuss what actions our congregation can take to support them.

Hope's new Right Relations Team, chaired by Michael Simpson, will begin reviewing the church's healthy relations, sexual harassment, and conflict resolution policies. They will also development new policies regarding how we all interact with each other.

The Board of Trustees is also working toward improving our facilities and grounds. Big decisions need to be made and we'll be reporting them to you over the next few months. We are also reviewing our hiring and other personnel policies.

October's Generosity recipient is New Sanctuary Network | Tulsa. New Sanctuary Network | Tulsa is an anti-deportation organization founded in 2016. They are migrant and asylum defenders shining a bright light on the darkness of ICE detention at the US/ Mexico border and in Tulsa County, where the Tulsa County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) contracts with ICE to deputize local law enforcement to serve as ICE agents and to warehouse detainees. Our work consists of advocacy, direct action and solidarity in gestures of radical welcome.

They meet every Friday from 12:00 to 12:15 at the David L. Moss Criminal Justice Center to protest the violence of deportation and hold a vigil for the lives lost in this corrupted system. You are welcome to join the vigil any Friday.

**Sign-up Parties** – These are events and parties that are typically more casual and reasonably affordable. **Silent Auction** – These are the smaller items and frequently include jewelry, handcrafts, housewares, etc. We ask that these be new or gently used items that are unique and will be attractive to our participants.


Women of Hope, 6 p.m.
