

Are You Ready for Renewal?

Money matters. This is especially true for not-for-profit agencies of change, like Hope Unitarian Church. It costs money to change lives, save the planet, build community, demand justice, make music, educate our children and youth, and grow to a sustainable size. Lofty ideals need sacred ground to anchor them. Hope's congregation needs wider horizons in which to offer, "Not hell but hope and courage," both to fulfill the meaning of our days, and to spread the good news of Unitarian Universalism.

That's why this year's pledge drive theme is "Ready For Renewal." After a long season of separation, it won't be long before we fling wide the doors, be with old friends, meet some of society's needs, garden, expect and welcome visitors, and worship together in spirit and in truth. The roof is being fixed, the parking lot will be paved, the staff is expanding (see below), and our hearts are opening to change. Trust me, this is no sinking ship! We're not sputtering along. We are moving at full throttle! We have hired Steven Williams to help us focus our efforts on member growth and retention. Steven will still be preaching on the Sundays I'm not in the pulpit, offering fresh perspectives on how we'll live our best lives now. We'll also have Steven available during the week, for five hours until he graduates this spring; then he'll work ten hours per week. Given that this is Steven's last year in seminary, he has accumulated a breadth of experience in the arts of ministry. He's offering pastoral care and will consult with Hope's wonderful RE program.

This is the essence of faith: to envision a lively, bustling, serving, growing, congregation before it comes to pass, and then planning as if the growth is occurring now. There are about 150-200 viewers for every virtual Sunday service, and some will show up on "opening day." If we treat these newcomers like we treat each other, we cannot help but grow! I'm not talking about becoming a large church, just a stronger one. One that is less encumbered with financial worry and laserfocused on its mission and vision. In other words, a healthy church that knows who it is and where it's going.

This, of course, is where you come in. We need your generosity like never before! Hope Church is approaching a crossroads in its historical journey. Is Hope a phoenix that is ready for renewal? Will Hope rise from the ashes of COVID, and complacency, and the status quo? This year, go out on faith and raise your pledge or make a new one. A member's matching grant will triple your investment. In fact, incorporate faith into all walks of your life and learn that risk-taking is often the path to redemption.



Our April Generosity Recipient is the Family Safety Center, whose services focus on helping families who are victims of domestic violence. Their goal is to provide "wrap-around" assistance at their downtown location with the objectives of obtaining protective orders, helping children exposed to domestic violence, offering forensic medical assistance and legal support, and ensuring that perpetrators are prosecuted. Domestic violence has increased during the Covid pandemic, which makes this organization especially important to our community right now.

The director of the Family Safety Center, **Suzann Stewart**, will be our Adult Forum speaker on Sunday, April 4, at 10 am.
