

# **Reflections from the Minister**

What does it mean to be a people of love?

Unitarian Universalism references love frequently. So does our local church and so do I. Love is a value that, as human beings, we need, but the problem is we will never deserve love, because that assumes love is given as payment. The problem is love cannot be calculated on a balance sheet. But love does have a cost, which means I will never be refunded the love I have given, because once given it cannot be withdrawn. I suppose we can stop loving someone, but we can never take away the love that we gave them. Of course, the decision not to love also has a cost.

We are never free of the cost whether we love or not. We cannot hoard love. Keeping it to ourselves does not net more love, in fact holding onto it too tightly causes it to wither. But there is a lot of confusion about love. We forget that love requires a level of mutuality and consent, which means it is hard to love others if at first, we are unable to love ourselves. Because then, we confuse being needed with being loved, or being used with being loved. Love has no quid pro quo. Love can have no expectation; we love others as they are and we love ourselves as we are, or it is not love.

Love is a decision. We choose to love ourselves, we choose to love each other, and we choose to love people who will refuse to love us back. We can do this because the actions of love are not always the same. Love is not expressed one way, nor should it be. Our relationships are different; that means our love is different.

I think one of the most important things we do in loving others is to help them learn to love themselves. Someone raised without love cannot understand it unless we show it to them. It is important to love those who cannot love themselves, for how else will they learn? How will they know their actions matter, their life matters? Love saves lives, including our own. So let's see how many lives we can save.

The <u>Surayya Anne Foundation</u> is a registered 501c3 nonprofit that operates a transitional housing program and also offers rent, utility bill, and grocery assistance to clients in the Tulsa area. The foundation focuses on Muslim women and children who are homeless, facing chronic or long-term illnesses, facing separation from families and spouses for whatever reason, or returning to society from incarceration, but anyone—regardless of race, religion, or creed—can be considered for their services. It has never been designated as a religious organization: it is a humanitarian organization.
