



Sunday Service

Our service starts at 11 a.m. On the first Sunday of the month, children join us. On other Sundays, they have their own service before attending their regular classes. Children are welcome in the sanctuary at their parents' discretion. We begin our service by lighting our chalice, a common ritual in many Unitarian Universalist congregations. Our service is a harmonious collaboration between our minister and our music program where we pause in wonder at the glorious gifts of life and we give thanks for the many blessings we have received. We create a space of healing and love where diversity of belief is celebrated. We hope that all find nourishment during our worship together.

Generosity Recipient

Each week, we give away ALL of the undesignated funds from our Sunday offering. The Outreach Committee chooses Non-Profit Organizations that are aligned with the mission of Hope Unitarian Church.

CYRE & Childcare

The mission of Hope's CYRE (Children and Youth Religious Educaiton) is to foster lifelong exploration of religious thought and values through a program that promotes spiritual development by means of free inquiry, mutual respect, and responsible behavior. All children and youth are welcome regardless of abilities, gender identity or orientation. Every week children join in free play, have a lesson and a workshop, chapel, snack, and outdoor play - as we are able.

Adult Forum

Adult Religious Education starts at 10:00 AM. Sessions vary and can involve speakers, book discussions, and congregational activities. Adult Forum is run by a team that is responsible for planning, coordinating, and presenting sessions. C Ways to Connect - Standing Committees

ACTION

An affiliation of faith and civic groups that work together to unite, educate, and facilitate action for the public good on issues of concern to people in the Tulsa metro area. If you are interested in learning about political activitsm and problems facing our communities, join an ACTION team.

Aesthetics

To ensure appropriate decor and order of the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall for Sunday services and special occasions.

Adult Forum Team

Plans topics and coordinates speakers for adult religious education on Sunday mornings.

Care Team

A team appointed by the Board of Trustees and the Minister to provide caring support to our members in multiple ways, including supporting members experiencing illness or other challenging life circumstances. Information received is protected by confidentiality unless given permission to share.

Facilities

Coordinates maintenance of our buildings, their contents, and equipment.

Gardens & Grounds

Assists in maintaining landscaping, gardens, trails, and ten acres of woodland. There are opportunities for the novice to the expert gardener.

Membership

Welcomes and provides information to visitors. Helps integrate new members into our community. Plans and promotes programs that support our membership.

Music Committee

Works with the Music Director to create and maintain a comprehensive music program at Hope. Helps to plan and coordinate special music events and concerts.

Outreach Committee

Provides members with opportunities to act on social justice issues. Supports the Day Center for the Homeless, including providing a monthly dinner. Selects nonprofit organizations for Hope's Generosity Receipient Program. Coordinates the Partners in Education Program.

Publicity & Marketing Committee

Welcoming Committee

Provides opportunities for education and outreach related to LGBTQ+. Chair is appointed by the Board President.

Women's Issues Group

Raises awareness of issues impacting women's and girl's well being, promotes activism on women's issues and celebrates and honors the history of the women's rights movement and contributions of women to our society.

CPrograms and Special Events

Activities Fair

An opportunity to learn more about our committees and programs. Takes place during an Adult Forum on a Sunday each Fall.

Annual Auction & Dinner

The church's largest fundraiser other than the Pledge Drive, held each Fall. A week-long online auction, followed by a special evening for adults (childcare available). An opportunity to dress up, enjoy a dinner, bid on special items, and have lots of fun!

Bookstore

Offers books for the taking, on a variety of topics, including UU material, world religions, philosophy, inspirational texts and so much more. Come browse the shelves for hidden treasures. If you have books you wish to donate, please bring them so our inventory can continue to grow. We also offer UU and Hope items for sale including pens, Hope lapel pins, UU stickers and more. Stop by and have a look.

Breakfast on the Hill

We come together 4 or 5 times each year to enjoy a warm breakfast before Sunday Service. Sponsored by various groups within the church.

Chili Cook-Off

A special event for a cold night in February. Bring your own special recipe to compete for prizes or just come to enjoy the food and fun.

Chocolate Auction

An opportunity to buy scrumptious chocolate treats in February, before Valentine's Day, and raise funds for the church.

Feed the Homeless

Provides a meal for the Day Center for the Homeless on the third Saturday each month. Offers many opportunities to volunteer to make or serve the meal. You can also donate clothes, cereal, or other needed items each month.

Generosity Recipient

Each month, a different non-profit organization receives all undesignated donations from our Sunday morning offerings.

Garage Sale

An opportunity to donate items you no longer need to this every-other-year fundraising event.

Holiday Star Tree

Each Christmas season, the Outreach Committee sponsors a different organization to receive gifts donated by Hope members and friends.

Hope Annual BBQ

Hope Annual BBQ - A special Saturday evening event with so much food and fun you don't want to miss it! Our own grill master, Rick Eagleton, cooks up his mouthwatering meats accompanied by side dishes galore. Come and enjoy!

Who Can Join?

Membership is open to any person, 16 years or older, who is in sympathy with the purpose and programs of this church. Membership has its privileges but is not required to experience Hope Unitarian Church.

Categories of Membership

There are two categories of membership: Voting and Non-voting. Voting members are eligible to vote in congregational meetings, or to be considered for a position on the Board of Trustees. An annual pledge or financial commitment to the church is required per our Bylaws.
