OASIS ASCENSION PROJECT NOVEMBER GENEROSITY RECIPIENT

The Oasis Ascension Project is pioneering a holistic approach to supporting people experiencing homelessness in Tulsa. Housed in a 48,000-square-foot facility at 10 N. Guthrie, the Oasis provides essential services designed to restore dignity and foster independence. Each participant receives secure access to digital copies of their ID, birth certificate, Social Security card, Medicaid, and SNAP cards through a facial recognition phone app virtual wallet. The facility also offers a private mailbox, lockers, showers, laundry, sensory and serenity rooms, a clinic and vet clinic, cafeteria, trading post, and work programs. This comprehensive environment helps members regain stability while addressing both practical and emotional needs.

The Oasis Ascension model emphasizes participation, engagement, and incentives. Members earn "program hours" by updating their daily portal, demonstrating medication compliance, and engaging in therapy, community service, or collaborative programs.

These hours translate into access to transitional living beds, low-barrier emergency overflow beds, and permanent supportive housing units. By combining experiential interventions, psychosocial rehabilitation, and curriculum work, the Oasis ensures that participants not only receive services but also gain the tools to rebuild their lives.

Beyond its innovative programming, Oasis Ascension is committed to breaking the stigma surrounding homelessness. The team encourages community members to approach the unhoused population with kindness, seeing them as individuals rather than challenges. Through collaboration with local agencies and a focus on individualized care, Oasis Ascension is setting a new standard for support services in Tulsa, offering hope, dignity, and a path toward long-term stability.

From the President's Desk: A Season of Grounding and Growth

As autumn settles in and we turn toward the season of gratitude, I want to share a few highlights from our Board's work this past quarter (July-September) and offer a reminder of the deep care that surrounds our Hope community.

Board Highlights: July-September

This quarter, the Board focused on strengthening our governance foundation and preparing for the year ahead. Key activities included:

- Board Retreat & Role Discernment: In September, we gathered for a retreat centered on clarifying board roles, streamlining responsibilities, and aligning our work with the congregation's evolving needs. Using feedback from the Congregational Survey and our bylaws, we explored new ways to foster transparency, collaboration, and spiritual grounding in our leadership practices. - Strategic Planning Conversations: We began mapping out priorities for the coming year, including stewardship, community engagement, and deepening our commitment to equity and inclusion. We have identified a need to proactively work on mapping out plans for Facilities Maintenance and Renovations, and renewing our Welcoming Congregation, and Green Sanctuary designations. We have also initiated the re-formation of a Healthy Relations Committee. The board supported the formation of a Logo Task Force to consider a Hope logo re-design. These conversations will continue into winter as we seek input from committees and members.
- Policy Exploration: In light of national concerns around immigration enforcement, we've begun exploring how UU congregations can establish policies regarding ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement). So far we have approved a policy establishing the Minister's Study, AV Room, and CYRE Director's office as designated "Private Spaces - Access limited to religious purposes of Hope Unitarian Church." Congregational Survey Summary

Total Responses: 46

Survey Period: Summer 2025

Compiled for: Hope Board Retreat

Key Themes & Insights

1. Governance & Communication

- Respondents expressed a strong desire for clearer decision-making processes and transparent communication from leadership.
- Many asked for more accessible explanations of board roles, responsibilities, and how decisions are made and shared.

2. Spiritual Engagement

- Members value spiritual depth and seek more opportunities for ritual, reflection, and multigenerational worship.
- There's interest in programming that integrates UU values with personal growth and community connection.

3. Community & Belonging

- A recurring theme was the importance of feeling heard, seen, and included.
- Respondents emphasized the need for intentional relationship-building across age groups and committees.

4. Leadership Development

- Many expressed interest in clearer pathways to leadership, including onboarding, mentorship, and succession planning.
- There's enthusiasm for legacy-building and cultivating a collaborative leadership culture.

5. Programming & Outreach

- Suggestions included expanding adult faith formation, social justice engagement, and intergenerational activities.
- Several respondents requested more flexible and accessible formats, such as hybrid options and varied scheduling.


